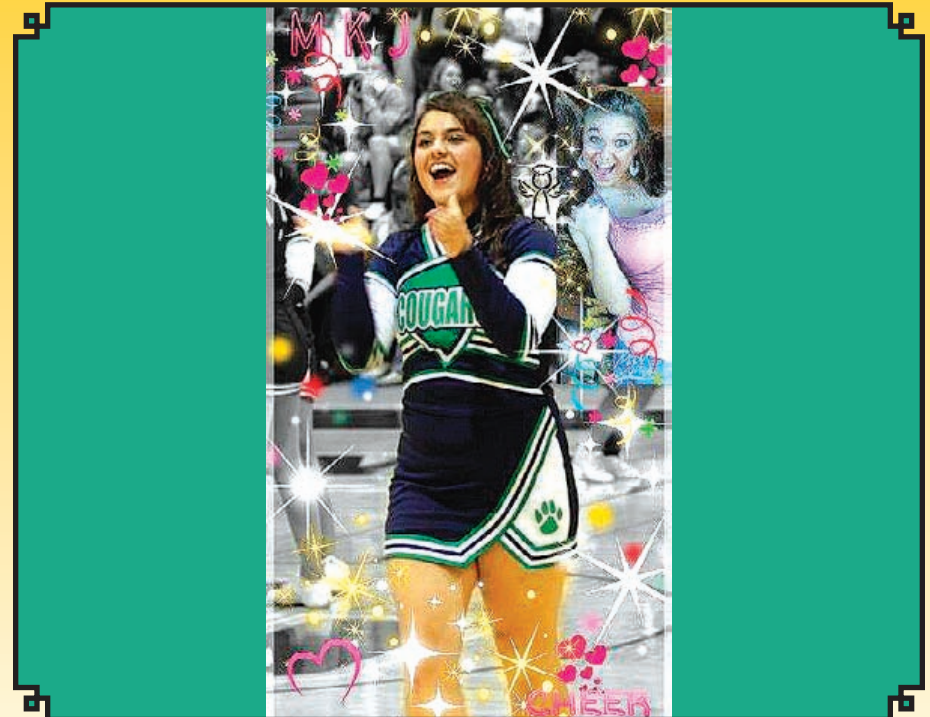

Woman looks back at relationships built through Girl Scouts

PHOENIX (AP) — The year Anna Maria Chávez turned 10, she went from having no sisters to having millions.

"My best friend came to school one day and said, 'I'm going to be a Girl Scout,' and I said, 'Well, I want to be a Girl Scout, too!' For me, it was an immediate sort of embracing of other girls," said Chávez, now 43.

"Suddenly, I had a sisterhood with

girls across the globe."

Chávez, an Eloy native, had support at home in her parents and grandmother, but she credits the encouragement of her peers and the Girl Scout community with propelling her to pursue her interest in law.

"Think about 1960s rural Arizona," she said. "We didn't have a lot of extracurricular activity. Yet by entering our organization, I became one of many.

"They looked at me when others may have seen a different story -- a girl

at risk, a girl perhaps in a poor community -- and they saw something else."

After Chávez and her family moved to Phoenix, where she graduated from Shadow Mountain High School, she attended Yale University on an academic scholarship and graduated from the University of Arizona law school.

She went on to hold high-level positions in federal and state government, working for former U.S. Secretary of Transportation Rodney Slater and former Arizona Gov. Janet Napolitano.

In November, she took on the role of CEO for Girl Scouts of the USA, becoming the first Hispanic woman to lead the organization of 2.3 million girl members and 890,000 volunteer adult members. The organization is celebrating its 100th birthday this year.

Chávez visited Arizona recently for the first time since becoming CEO. She was surprised by Ambassador scouts from Shadow Mountain High School, who presented her with gifts from her alma mater.

Before heading to Eloy for a home-

coming, she sat down with The Republic to talk about her nearly lifelong relationship with the organization and the value of investing in girls.

Q: You've had an impressive career in other sectors. How have those roles prepared you for your current position?

A: I've been very fortunate to have had a career for almost 20 years now as a public servant ... and to have worked for a lot of great people, a lot of great leaders who taught me that at the end of the day, it's about how you give back.

I've been able to be part of organizations that, on a daily basis, are thinking about who can they help, who are their customers and how can we make this country stronger. (My current role) allows me to continue this course of public service.

Q: What has changed about the Girl Scouts since the time you first joined?

A: The organization itself definitely has the same core mission, but the things around the girls have changed.

Girls now have technology in a way that we've never seen in the past. When I grew up in Eloy, I think the big invention was the microwave. But now, the girls' world is a global world.

Q: What specific goals or initiatives will you pursue as CEO?

A: We recently launched ... the largest advocacy campaign dedicated to girl leadership in the nation's history, called "To Get Her There" (togetherthere.org). It's focused on creating a gender-balanced leadership model here in the United States.

What we've found is, although girls see leadership in their communities, many of them unfortunately don't see the (specific) leadership model they aspire to and consequently they sometimes opt out of the opportunity. ...

If half the population isn't involved in creating solutions to the problems in the United States, then we're missing the opportunity to groom their intellect, their ideas and creativity around these solutions.

So essentially, what we're doing with that campaign is engaging adults from across the spectrum, whether they're military, whether they're leaders in government, whether they're CEOs and businesses, whether they're faith leaders, to ... invest time, invest dollars into supporting girls ... so that in 20 years, they'll be prepared and excited to be part of these solutions for the U.S.

I'd also like to ask people to spare some time, some expertise to volunteer for the local Girl Scout councils. When I was in Texas (serving as CEO of Girl Scouts of Southwest Texas), I found girls everywhere who wanted to be Girl Scouts, but if I couldn't get an adult to volunteer and step up and say

"I will be there to support them," we couldn't bring in more girls.

The reality is, girls are amazing. Sit down and have a conversation with them about some of the issues that they're tackling within Girl Scouts. They're thinking big. They're thinking solutions.

And we're hoping that we can reach more, because right now we only serve 8 percent of girls ages 5-17 in the United States. Imagine if we doubled that percentage.

Q: In light of some recent controversial issues at the local level (such as the outcry that followed a Colorado troop's decision to allow a 7-year-old transgender child into the group), how do you view your role in terms of influencing local troops?

A: My role is to be external, to be what I would call the "team leader" for our national movement. I truly believe that the Girl Scout story is a quiet story.

Think about the millions of community-service hours they give every year without fanfare. Think about the cookie program -- every year, the girls raise \$760 million, which they reinvest back into their local communities, into homeless shelters, into animal shelters, meal sites, community-service projects for the parks.

I see my opportunity as a leader of this organization as one to tell their story.

But at the Iowa Capitol in Des Moines recently, the tittering was more than just therapeutic.

It was Laugh Out Loud Day, which was a statewide effort by Iowa's Healthiest State Initiative to spread the health benefits of laughter.

Liz Cox is a project manager for the initiative. She told The Des Moines Register that sleep, exercise and laughter are good ways to metabolize stress.

Clowns raised the merriment level at the Capitol by handing out balloons, silk flowers and oversized coins.

Third-graders from a West Des Moines school batted around beach balls and took part in a fitness routine led by state Department of Public Health employees dressed as fruits and vegetables.

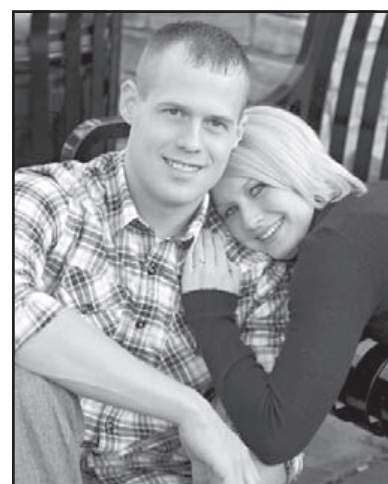

British Airways unveils Olympic-themed jets

LONDON (AP) — It's a bird, it's a plane! It's a plane that looks a bit like a bird.

British Airways has unveiled the first in a flock of Olympic-themed jets that will fly during this summer's London Games.

The Airbus A319, which has been painted to resemble a giant gold dove, has gone into service, the first of nine similarly deco-

rated Olympic planes.

Artist Tracey Emin mentored designer Pascal Anson, who created the look of the plane. Emin said she loved the design, which "brings back the excitement of travel."

The planes are one of several Olympic-themed projects for British Airways designed to celebrate

British creative talent.

Chef Heston Blumenthal is helping colleague Simon Hulstone develop in-flight meals inspired by traditional British cookery and the 1948 London Olympics, and actor Richard E. Grant has helped writer Prasanna Puwanarajah script a short film to be shown on flights.

All three projects, though not an actual Airbus, are on display at an aviation-themed pop-up restaurant, gallery and cinema in London.

W. Va. town opens zip line tour

MOUNDSVILLE, W.Va. (AP) - This Ohio River town's 650-acre Grand View Park is launching a zip line canopy tour featuring five miles of cable and chair-style body harnesses.

Manager Craig White says he's hoping to make the park one of West Virginia's newest outdoor adventure destinations.

The State Journal says the zip line runs will range from 340 feet to 2,200 feet. White says they'll stretch over valleys and provide spectacular city views.

White says a guided tour lasts about 3½ hours, while the 2,200-foot long ride takes about 30 minutes.

White says the zip line cost about \$560,000 but gives Grand View the wow factor it was lacking.

It also adds to other area attractions, including the former West Virginia penitentiary, and the Marx Toy and Fostoria Glass museums.

N.H. town preparing for 250th anniversary

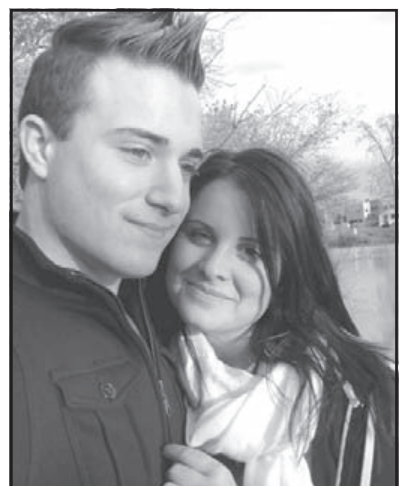
MEREDITH, N.H. (AP) — The New Hampshire town of Meredith is celebrating its 250th birthday in six years. But according to one resident, it's not too early to start planning.

Jim Hughes, who served as chairman of the school board when the town marked its 200th anniversary, wants officials to be prepared for the 250th.

He proposed the town start collecting money now. He even jokingly proposed levying a "voluntary celebration tax" of \$2.50 on residents and visitors starting this year to fund the celebration in 2018.

The Laconia Daily Sun reports selectmen said it was premature to convene a committee and mount a fundraising campaign and suggested the board find out how the town celebrated for the 200th anniversary back in 1968. Hughes said there were commemorative gold and silver coins.

Lucas is the son of David Karhoff and Jennifer Griffin.

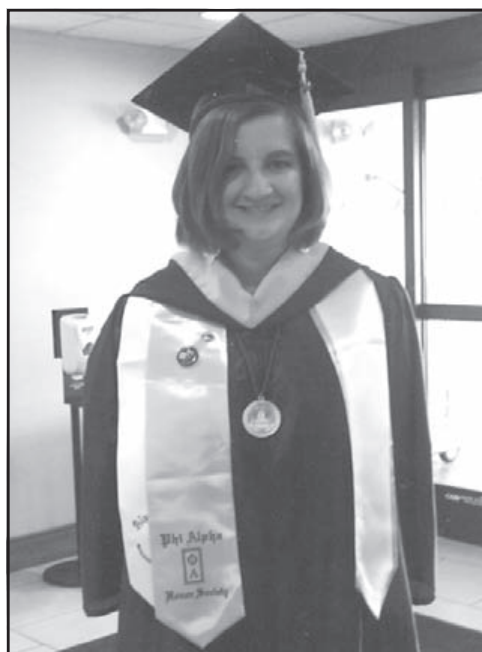
